1. Fourth Arts Block (FAB!) Festival 2012 on East 4th Street between Bowery and 2nd Avenue:

Enjoy a variety of dance, theater and music performances by local artists and activities from FABnyc's partners. Local artisans and gourmet food vendors and hands-on activities for families are just a couple of the other things planned for this event.
